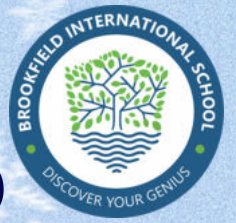

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SPORTSPERENZA'23

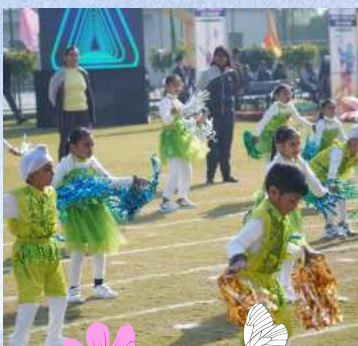


"Sports teaches you character, it teaches you to play by the rules, it teaches you to know what it feels like to win and lose-it teaches you about life." - Billie Jean King.

But nutritious veggies there.



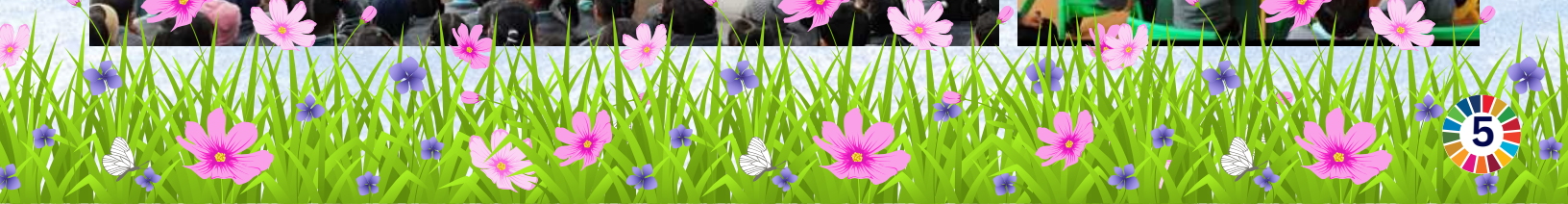

This can also help them learn that what they read has meaning. Baking is a great way to help improve their math skills. There is a lot of counting, measuring, and fractions involved in baking, which allows children to practice and improve their math skills. Baking also helps children improve their motor skills as well.
